$$-u_{xx} = f(x)$$

$$u(0) = 0$$

$$u'(1) = 0$$

Dirichlet

Neumann

$$\int_0^1 -u_{xx} \cdot v \, dx = \int_0^1 f v \, dx$$

$$\int_0^1 u_x v_x \, dx - u_x v \Big|_0^1 = \int_0^1 f v \, dx$$

integration
by parts

Find $u \in V \leftarrow$ some space

$$\int_0^1 u_x v_x \, dx$$

$$-u_x v \Big|_0^1 = \int_0^1 f v \, dx$$

such that
for all $v \in V$

for now

$$\text{let } V = \left\{ u \mid \begin{array}{l} \|u\| < \infty \\ u(0) = 0 \end{array} \right\}$$

→ find $u \in V$ s.t.

$$\int_0^1 u_x v_x dx$$

~~$$- u_x v \Big|_{x=1} = \int_0^1 f v dx$$~~

$\forall v \in V.$

→ this imposes $u_x = 0$
at $x=1$

→ find $u \in V$ s.t.

$$\int_0^1 u_x v_x dx$$

$$\underbrace{\langle u_x, v_x \rangle}$$

$$\underbrace{a(u, v)}$$

$$= \int_0^1 f v dx$$

$$\langle f, v \rangle$$

↑ inner product.

$$\forall v \in V.$$

bilinear form

$$a(u, v) = \langle u_x, v_x \rangle$$

$$F(v) = \langle f, v \rangle$$

linear functional

Find $u \in V$ s.t.

$$a(u, v) = F(v)$$

+ $v \in V$.

$$\text{let } V = \left\{ v \in L^2([0, 1]) \mid \begin{array}{l} a(v, v) < \infty \\ v(0) = 0 \end{array} \right\}$$

$$= \left\{ u \mid \int_0^1 u^2 dx < \infty \right\}$$

Things we know

① Weak solutions are strong solutions

if $u \in C^2 \cap V$

and $a(u, v) = F(v) \forall v$

weak

Then

$$-u_{xx} = f$$

strong

② The Ritz-Galerkin approximation is

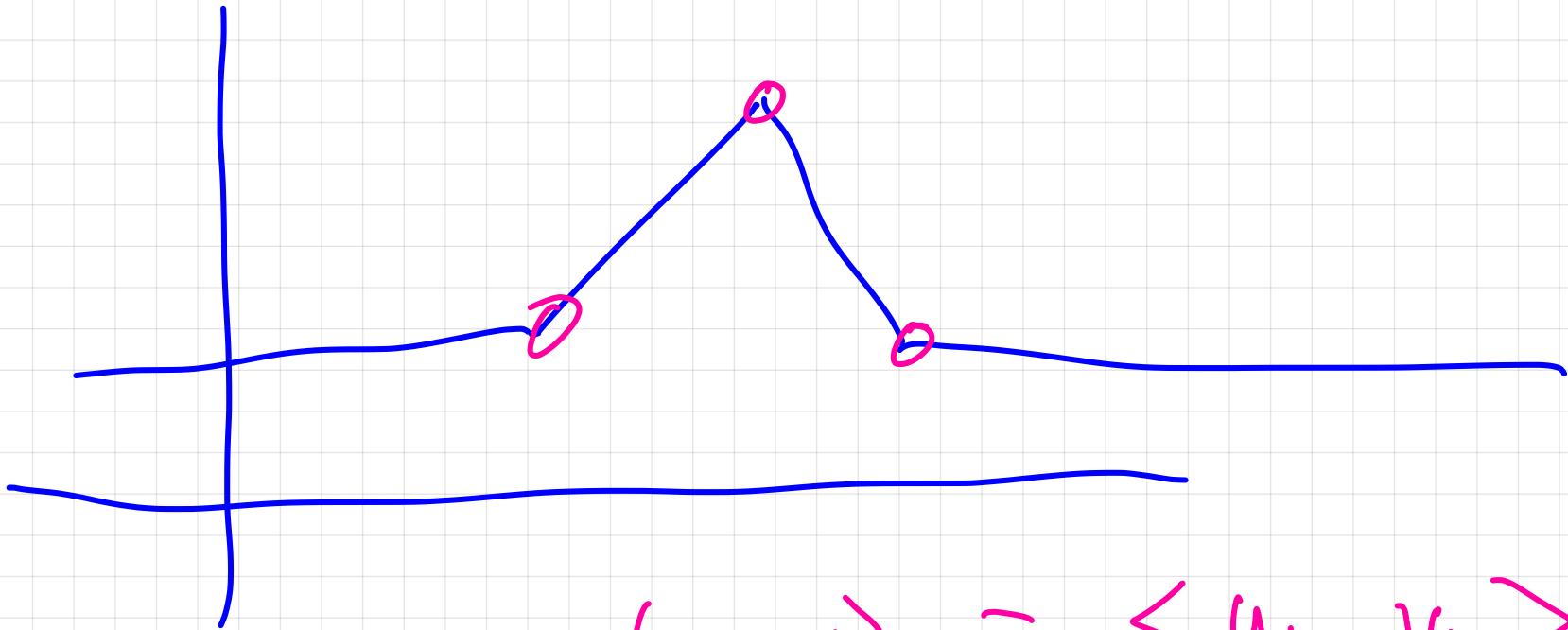
let $V^h \subset V$

find $u^h \in V^h$ st.

$$a(u^h, v) = F(v) \forall v \in V^h.$$

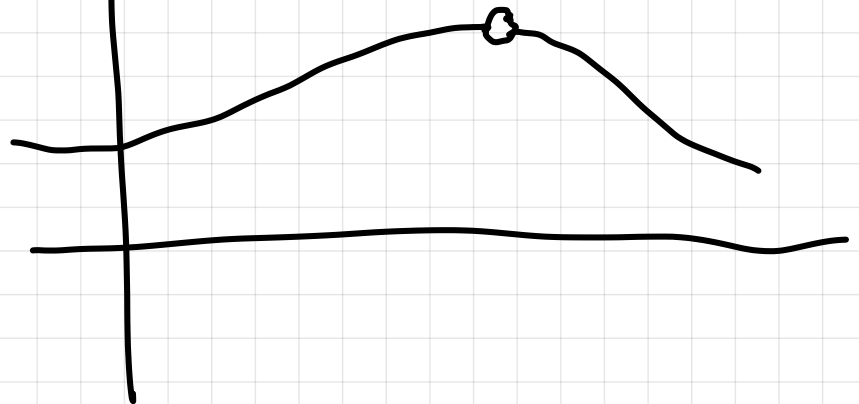
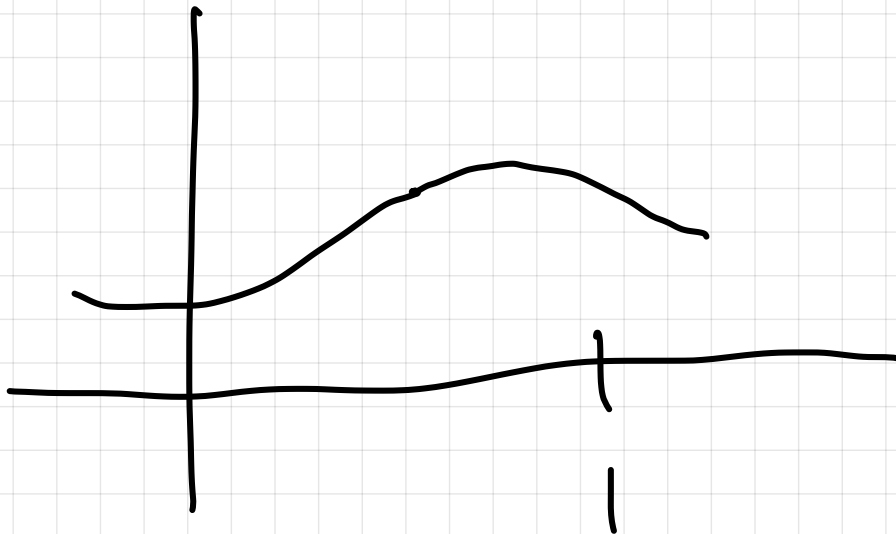
③ if $f \in L^2$

then there exists a unique u^h .



$$a(u, v) = \langle u_x, v_x \rangle$$

$$= \int_0^1 u_x v_x dx$$



④ orthogonality:

if u satisfies $a(u, v) = \langle f, v \rangle \quad \forall v \in V$
if u^h satisfies $a(u^h, v^h) = \langle f, v^h \rangle \quad \forall v^h \in V^h$

then $e = u - u^h$ satisfies
 $a(e, v^h) = 0 \quad \forall v^h \in V^h$

⑤ u^h is "the best" thing in V^h .

Cea's Lemma

$$\|u - u^h\|_e = \min_{v^h \in V^h} \|u - v^h\|_e$$

$$\|u\|_e^2 = a(u, u)$$

strong: find $u \in C^2$ s.t. $-u_{xx} = f$
 $u(0) = u'(1) = 0$

Weak: find $u \in V$ s.t. $\langle u_x, v_x \rangle = \langle f, v \rangle$
 $\forall v \in V$

discrete weak: find $u^h \in V^h \subset V$ s.t.
 $\langle u_x^h, v_x^h \rangle = \langle f, v^h \rangle$
 $\forall v^h \in V^h$

$$V = \left\{ v \mid \langle v_x, v_x \rangle < \infty \right.$$

$$\left. v(0) = 0 \right\}$$

$V^h = ?$

- ① cosines, sines?
- ② all polynomials of degree $\leq p$
- ③ all piecewise polynomials of degree $\leq p$

Define a mesh:

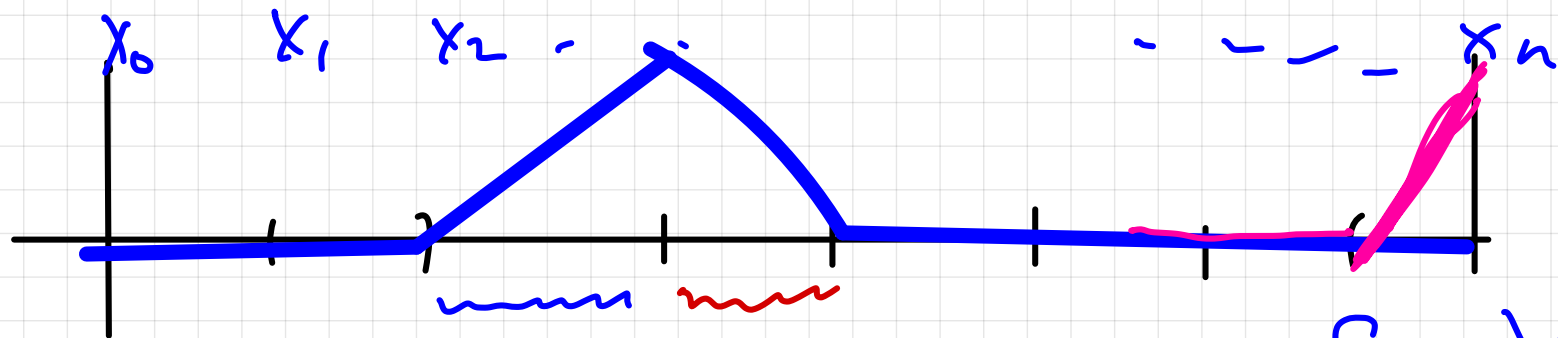


$$\tau^i = [x_{i-1}, x_i]$$

= "element" of the mesh.

let $V_k^h = \left\{ u \in C^0([0,1]) \mid u(x) \text{ is a polynomial of degree } \leq k \text{ on each } [x_{i-1}, x_i] \right\}$

φ
 $k = \text{degree}$



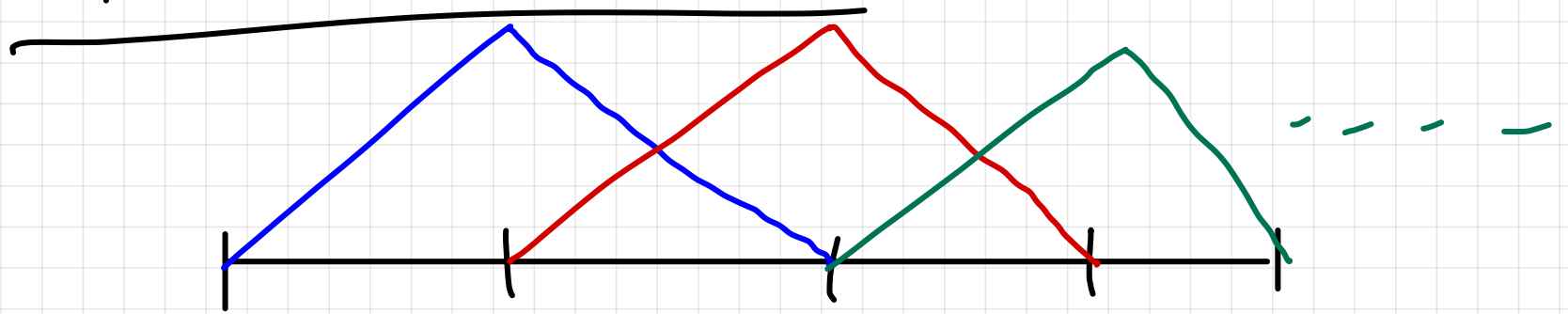
let $\{\phi_i\}$ be a basis for V_h

$$\phi_i(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{x - x_{i-1}}{x_i - x_{i-1}} & x \in [x_{i-1}, x_i] \\ \frac{x_{i+1} - x}{x_{i+1} - x_i} & x \in [x_i, x_{i+1}] \\ 0 & \text{else} \end{cases}$$

$$i = 1, \dots, n-1$$

$$\phi_n(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{x - x_{n-1}}{x_n - x_{n-1}} \\ 0 \end{cases}$$

"The Interpolant"



let $w \in V$
the **interpolant** of w is

$$w_I^h \in V^h.$$

$$w_I^h(x) = \sum_{i=1}^n w(x_i) \phi_i(x)$$

Approximation Property (Thm 4.14)

let $h = \max_i h_i$

let $w \in C^2 \cap V$

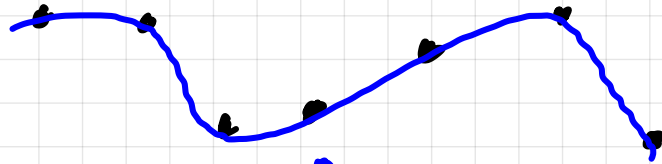
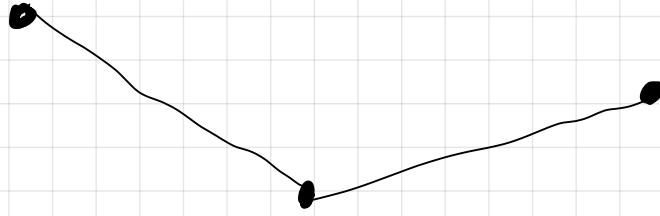
$$\text{Then } \|w - w_{\#}^h\|_e \leq \frac{h}{\sqrt{2}} \|w''\|$$

Result

$f \in C^0$

$u \in C^2 \cap V$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{then } \|u - u^h\| &\leq \frac{h}{\sqrt{2}} \|u - u^h\|_e \\ &\leq \frac{h^2}{\sqrt{2}} \|f\| \end{aligned}$$

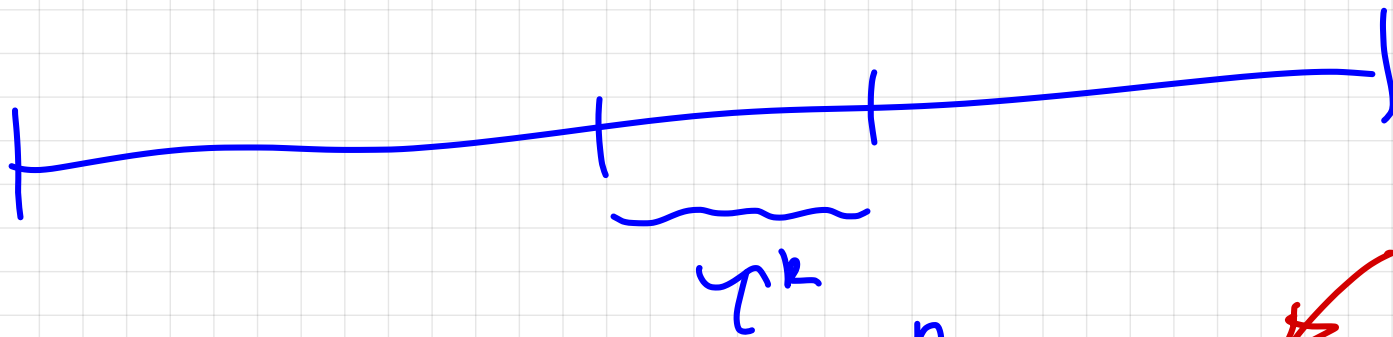


Assembly

$$\langle u_x, v_x \rangle = \langle f, v \rangle \quad \forall v \in V^h$$

$$\Omega = [0, 1]$$

$$\tau^k = [x_{k-1}, x_k]$$

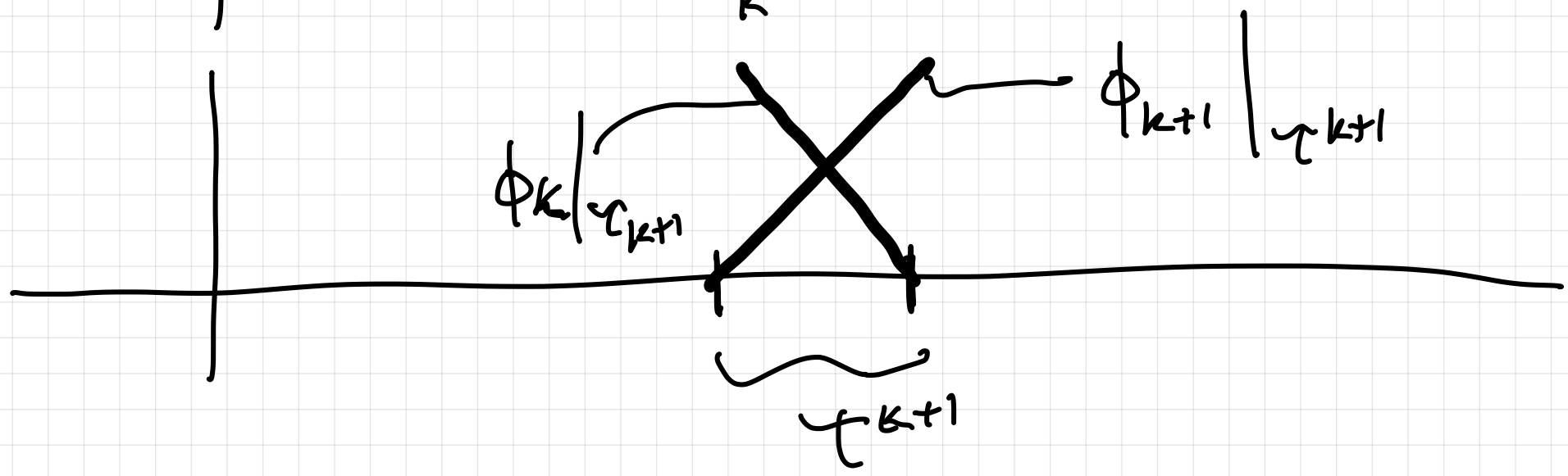
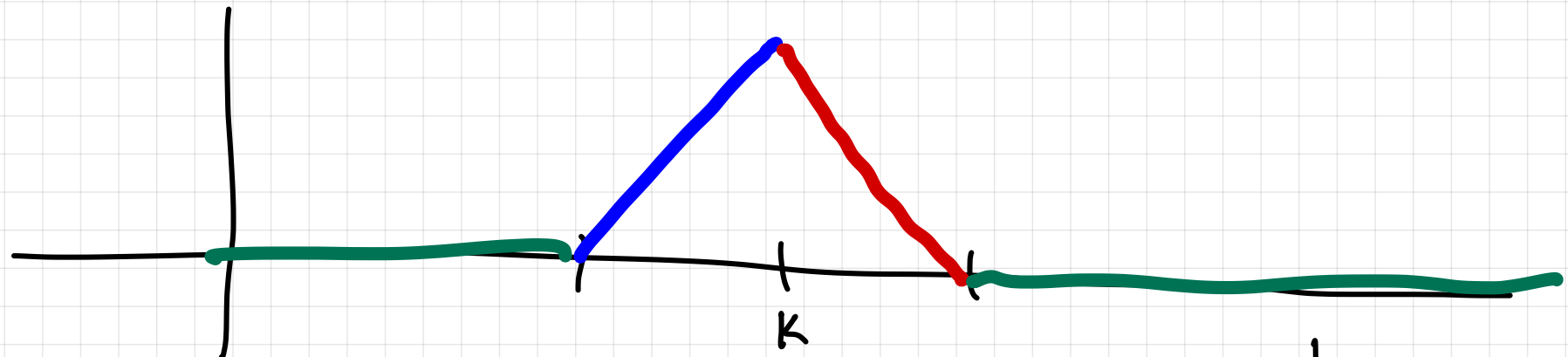


$$\text{let } u^h(x) = \sum_{j=1}^n u_j \phi_j(x)$$

"hat" funcs

→ Find \underline{u} st.

$$\langle u'_i, \phi'_i \rangle = \langle f, \phi_i \rangle \quad \forall i=1, \dots, n$$



let $\lambda_{k-1}(x) = \frac{\phi_{k-1}(x)}{\gamma_k}$ $\lambda_k(x) = \frac{\phi_k(x)}{\gamma_k}$

① linear ✓

② $\lambda_k + \lambda_{k-1} = 1$

$$\frac{x_k - x}{x_k - x_{k-1}} + \frac{x - x_{k-1}}{x_k - x_{k-1}} = 1$$

③ $\frac{d\lambda_{k-1}}{dx} = \frac{1}{x_k - x_{k-1}}$

$$\frac{d\lambda_k}{dx} = -\frac{1}{x_k - x_{k-1}}$$

$$\langle u_n, \phi_i \rangle = \langle f, \phi_i \rangle \quad i=1 \dots n$$

$$u_n = \sum u_j \phi_j$$

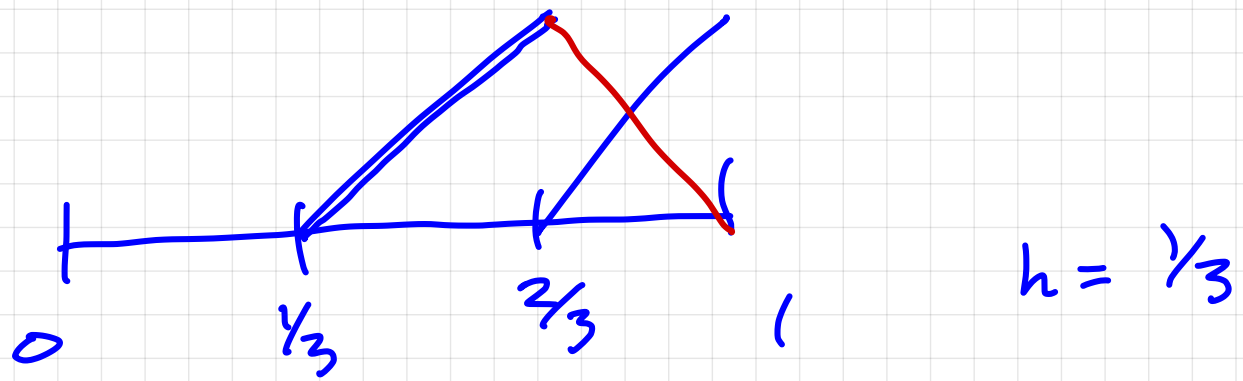
$$\sum_{j=1}^n u_j \int_0^1 \frac{d\phi_j}{dx} \cdot \frac{d\phi_i}{dx} dx = \int_0^1 f \phi_i dx$$

element
stiffness
matrix

$$\sum_{j=1}^n u_j \underbrace{\sum_{\substack{\tau^k \in T_h \\ \tau^k}} \int_{\tau^k} \frac{d\phi_j}{dx} \frac{d\phi_i}{dx} dx}_{a_{ij}} = \sum_{\tau^k} \int_{\tau^k} f \phi_i dx$$

$$\hookrightarrow \underline{A} \cdot \underline{u} = \underline{f}$$

Example



$$\int_{\tau_k} \phi_{k-1}' \phi_{k-1}' dx = \int_{\tau_k} \frac{1}{h} \cdot \frac{1}{h}$$
$$= \frac{1}{h^2} = \frac{1}{h}$$

$$\int_{\tau_k} \phi_{k-1}' \phi_k' dx = \int_{\tau_k} \frac{1}{h} \left(-\frac{1}{h}\right)$$
$$= -\frac{1}{h^2} = -\frac{1}{h}$$

$$A^k = \frac{1}{h} \begin{pmatrix} 1 & -1 \\ -1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$\langle f, \phi_i \rangle$

let $f=1$

$$\int_{x_{k-1}}^{x_k} 1 \cdot \phi_i(x) dx = \int_{x_{k-1}}^{x_k} \frac{x-x_k}{h} dx = \left. \frac{(x-x_k)^2}{2h} \right|_{x_{k-1}}^{x_k}$$

$$A = \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 1 & f^k \\ 1 & 0 \\ 0 & 1 \\ 0 & 0 \end{bmatrix} + \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 1 \\ 0 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix} = \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ 0 & 1 \\ 0 & 0 \end{bmatrix} + \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 0 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ 0 & 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$= \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 1 & -1 & -1 \\ -1 & 2 & -1 & -1 \\ -1 & 2 & -1 & -1 \\ -1 & -1 & 1 & 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$f = \frac{1}{h} \begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 2 \\ 2 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}$$

$$u_0 = 0$$
$$\rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} 2 & -1 & & \\ -1 & 2 & -1 & \\ & -1 & 1 & \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} u_1 \\ u_2 \\ u_3 \end{bmatrix} = \frac{h}{2} \begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ 2 \\ 1 \end{bmatrix}$$
